

The Institute for Biomedical Research of the Universidad Nacional Autónoma de México (UNAM) is opening applications for tenure track research positions, according to clause 51 of the Statute for Academic Personal of the UNAM and invites those who fulfil the requirements as outlined below, to apply. The position starts as full time associate scientist "C" in the areas of physiology, immunology, cellular biology, health and environment, molecular biology, biotechnology, neurosciences, non-infectious diseases and systems biology. The monthly salary is 19,014.00 Mexican pesos above which financial bonuses and associated benefits are possible.

Requirements:

- Applicants should have obtained a doctoral degree and have postdoctoral experience.
- They should have at least 5 publications in international journals, demonstrating a history of high-quality scientific achievement.
- Female applicants should be less than 39 years of age, and men less than 37 years of age.

Applicants should submit the following documents to Dr. Emilio Rojas, Academic Secretary,

- A long term research plan (maximum of 5 pages).
- A letter of application summarizing research interests and experience.
- A list of publications together with a brief explanation of their relevance to the research area of interest.
- A current *Curriculum vitae* accompanied by supporting documents.
- Three letters of recommendation.
- A research plan (maximum 5 pages).
- A work plan that can be realistically completed within the next three years (maximum 2 pages).

Chosen applicants will be notified by email of the date and time when they should attend an interview (in person or electronically). Some candidates may also be invited to give a presentation at the Institute of Biomedical Research as part of the selection procedure.

Applications will be evaluated by the relevant academic bodies of the Institute for Biomedical Research, and the selected applicants' documents will be submitted for examination and approval to the Scientific Research Council UNAM.

This procedure does not imply an application for tenure as stipulated by the Statutes for Academic Personal of the UNAM. The decision of the academic bodies of the Institute for Biomedical Research and UNAM is final and without appeal.
